On April 6, 2021, XPO Logistics, Inc. announced a buy-out offer to be followed by a squeeze-out for the remaining 341,887 shares of XPO Logistics Europe S.A. that it does not already own, at a price of $\mathfrak{E}315$ per share. It is expected that the total cash consideration to be paid in connection with this offer will be approximately $\mathfrak{E}108$ million. The offer will be subject to review by the Supervisory Board of XPO Logistics Europe S.A., as well as the Autorité des marches financiers in France, and is expected to close in the first half of June 2021.
